Our calendars tell us that it is time once again to offer Thanks to God, for all of life's rich blessings. It is usually a time that we would gather with family and friends to eat too much, gain a few pounds, to watch parades, football, nap and then eat some more. This year may be different for us; smaller family gathering, less invited guests and possible depressed and anxious. The Bible declares that thanksgiving is to be our re-God's goodness towards sponse us; it needs to be a heart-felt attitude, not just a vocal Rev. Jeff Coggins, Pastor statement, or an event to gather to eat.

Long before Thanksgiving Day became a tradition for our nation, Scripture, and the Spirit guided God's

people to give thanks. In America's history, we think of the Pilgrims in 1621 at Plymouth, and look at that first Thanksgiving shared with the small community, and their Native American guests of the Wamanong tribes who helped them through the first harsh winter, and help make the first year's harvest a success. Many other settler's also observed days of Thanksgiving, as God gave them blessings in the "new land.'

During the time of the Revolutionary war, America celebrated eight special days of Thanksgiving for victories and protection in times of trouble. On November 26, 1789, President George Washington issued a proclamation of a Day of thanks. For many years, America did not have a National Day of Thanksgiving, until 1863, when President Abraham Lincoln, proclaimed the last Thursday in November as a day of thanksgiving. From 1621 to 1863, (242 years) Thanksgiving was not a nationally observed holiday.

Through times of trouble, devastating wars, and other difficulties, we learn to trust God, and give thanks for all the help and blessings given to us.

The days in which we are living, at times seem uncertain and challenging, but with God's blessing and thankful hearts, we will not lose hope, because the God in whom we trust is our Source of life. Be glad, and make this a true season of Thanksgiving.

This is Winter Safety Awareness Week

The East Ohio Disaster Response Committee wants to remind folks that the best way to respond to hazardous weather is advance preparation. As seasons change, this is a good time to do a few simple things that can make a big difference in coming months.

Practice Fire Safety & Prevention: People will be indoors now more than ever with the colder temperatures and the continuing pandemic. So take action now to protect your home and family by having working smoke detectors in the home, conducting fire drills, change the batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, have auxiliary heating sources serviced, and never leave cooking food unattended.

Prepare Your Home's Exterior: Remove and cut away low-hanging and dead tree branches to prevent them falling on your home and clean your gutters to prevent snow and ice buildup.

Prepare Home & Vehicle Emergency Kits: Winter emergency kits should include flashlights, batteries, blankets, coats, hats, gloves, a battery-operated radio/weather radio, first-aid kit, cell phone and charger, and enough nonperishable food and water to sustain every household member for several days.

Caldwell UMC Youth Plan A "Socially Distanced Christmas"

Have you ever gone to one of the outdoor light shows that pop up around Christmas time? Have you ever wondered if this is something you could have in your own town? The youth group thought the same thing. 2020 would be the best time to have such a thing. Families can drive up to the church parking lot and watch the show from the comfort and safety of their own car. With the music streaming through their car radio instead of speakers blaring throughout the town. The youth plan on working on this the last weekend of November. With plans to have the show occur nightly up to and through Christmas. They were able to purchase the needed equipment from a grant received from the Southern Hills District of the UMC as a part of church outreach. What the grant doesn't cover the youth group plans to pay for. As part of a fundraiser for next year's Christmas and possibly this coming Easter the youth will be doing memory trees as part of the show. 16 live Christmas trees will be purchased from Hrinko tree farm. 12 of them are cut trees and 4 will still have the roots attached. The youth are asking for a minimum donation of \$30 each for a cut tree and \$50 each for the other trees with roots. Your donation will go towards next year's improvements and the youth will place a laminated sign of who your tree is in memory of at the base of the tree. The 4 trees that can be replanted the sponsor can have the tree after the show is done for the year to plant at their own home. If you would like to sponsor a memory tree please send your donation and name of family member/members to the church office. Please make checks out to the Caldwell UMC youth group with memory tree in the comments. Trees will be first come first served but if participation exceeds the number of trees more than one family may need to sponsor a tree. Stay tuned for further updates. 




