The Pastor's Page: "No Greater Love"

> based on Matthew 28:19

Jesus said, "This is my commandment: love one another as I have loved you. There is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:12-13). The month of February is often associated with St.

Valentine – or Valentine's Day on February 14th. It's fun to give and receive Valentine's Day cards and go out to eat with family and friends. But that isn't what this holiday is about. Valentine's Day is about the self-sacrificial love of God and the Saint whose name is associated with the holiday, fulfilled Jesus' command to love one another. There were three Saints named Valentine in the Catholic tradition. The first was a priest and a physician in early Rome, who was arrested and killed for his faith. The second, Bishop of Interamna (now Terni, located about 60 miles from Rome). He too was

arrested and killed during the time of Emperor Claudius II. The third St. Valentine suffered martyrdom in Africa with several companions. However, nothing further is known about this saint.



In all, these men, each named St. Valentine, showed heroic love for the Lord and His Church.

There are other legends that Saint Valentine was under orders not to marry anyone but did so against the wishes of rulers in Rome. He too was put to death because of his faith in love and his defiance of Roman rule. What about us, as Christians today? Would we be willing to "lay down our lives for our friends?" Would we be courageous enough to stand up to someone who was against our faith? Could we – would we – love them anyway?

Love is a difficult word, especially in our society today. Many times, we love things and use people instead of the opposite. We "love our cell phones, our dogs, our cars," and yet we fail to love the people we are closest to. How many times have we failed to tell someone how much they mean to us and how much we love them? Don't wait until Valentine's Day! Don't do it just once a year. Tell people how you feel! Love them and care about them - now.

If you love people, then you want them to know the love of Jesus as well. If you love someone, you (Continued from page 1)

will tell them about salvation. You want them to know where they will spend eternity. If you love people, you will find a way to courageously and boldly share your faith. That's what St. Valentine is remembered for.

The Greek language has six words for love. They mean different things but because our words as "love," we fail to understand the differences. The six words in Greek are: Eros, or sexual *passion*. *Philia*, or deep friendship. *Ludus*, or playful

love. *Agape*, or self-sacrificial love. Pragma, or longstanding love. *Philautia*, or love of the self. Can you see how confusing Jesus, His only Son, who gave it is? What Jesus is saying in the verse from John's Gospel is that we need AGAPE love. That's what each of the three St. Valentine's stood for – AGAPE love. What do we stand for today?

Take a moment and list those English language translates these you need to contact and pray for. Tell those you love how much they mean to you. Think about the Scripture from John and pray that God will use you in his service today to share His love

with others. Don't just say you will do it – take action!

God's best Valentine to us is His life for us. Thank God for this amazing gift of love. Pray that others may know this Love for themselves. Reflect God's love this Valentine's Day and every day!

"Love is when someone hurts you, and you get so mad but you don't yell at them because you know it would hurt their feelings."






