
Psalm 111



86% of online passwords are not secure.

Unfortunately, hackers love lazy passwords. With the help of password-cracking programs and ever-increasing computing power, it's pretty easy for hackers to guess weak passwords, even if they're encrypted or hashed.

A strong password is:

Long: At least 16 characters

Unique: Every online account should have its own password

National Bird Feeding Month – February

The birds have it tough in winter. They have families to feed and the natural resources to do so aren't as plentiful as at other times of the year. That's where we can all chip in and help. National Bird Feeding Month is a chance for bird feeders, watchers, and anyone else who is feeling in the spirit to extend a hand out to our flying friends.

Feeding birds in your backyard is entertaining, educational, and an inexpensive pastime that can be enjoyed by children and adults. One-third of the U.S. adult population feeds wild birds in their backyards

Birds struggle to get non-frozen water in the winter. If possible, adding a heated birdbath, fountain or even a large bowl of warm water would help greatly.

Foods you can leave out include birdseed mixture, lard, and beef suet, meaty canned pet food, brown or white rice, crumbled bread, mildly grated cheese, and so much more. Birds guts are not able to digest milk or metabolize salt or coconut.

February 1, 1960 - In Greensboro, North Carolina, four African American students sat down and ordered coffee at a lunch counter inside a Woolworth's store.

February 11, 1990 - In South Africa, Nelson Mandela, at age 71, was released from prison after serving 27 years of a life sentence on charges of attempting to overthrow the apartheid government. In April 1994, he was elected president in the first all-race elections.

February 19, 1942 - Internment of Japanese Americans began after President Franklin Roosevelt issued an Executive Order requiring those living on the Pacific coast to report for relocation. Over 110,000 persons therefore shut down their businesses, sold off their property, quit school and moved inland to the relocation centers.

February 23, 1991 - In Desert Storm, the Allied ground offensive began after a devastating month-long air campaign targeting Iraqi troops in both Iraq and Kuwait.

Groundhog Day - February 2

Groundhog Day is on February 2 and we wait with bated (and ice-cold) breath to see whether or not winter will continue for another six weeks.

Punxsutawney Phil has been correct 39% of the time.

February 2 is also the date of the Christian festival of Candlemas, also called the feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin. During the Middle Ages there arose the belief that animals such as the badger and the bear interrupted their hibernation to appear on this day. If the day was sunny and the animal saw its shadow, six more weeks of winter weather remained. If, however, the day was cloudy, it was a sign that the weather during the following weeks would be mild, leading to an early spring

A Season of Penance Before Lent



Septuagesima is the ancient period of time observed for two and a half weeks before the start of Lent. Celebrated on the Third Sunday before the First Sunday in Lent. This time, informally called "Pre-Lent," is a

time for us to focus on the need for a Savior. It is a time to begin weaning ourselves from food so that we may more easily observe the strictest fast during Lent. This year it would fall on Jan. 28.

The 17-day period beginning on Septuagesima Sunday was intended to be observed as a preparation for the season of Lent, which is itself a period of spiritual preparation (for Easter). In many countries, however, Septuagesima Sunday marked and still marks the traditional start of the carnival season, culminating on Shrove Tuesday, sometimes known as Mardi Gras.

The liturgical books for the Ordinary Form of the Roman Rite revised after the Second Vatican Council omit Septuagesima. In Western tradition the Septuagesima is now part of "Ordinary Time". Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14, 2024) is the accepted beginning of Lent.




2024 is a Leap Year

Did you know that the phenomenon that occurs every four years is in fact a corrective measure? The actual number of days in a regular year is 365.2422 days long, and not 365 days. That is why the extra day is added to February, the shortest month, to balance out this discrepancy, and play catch up.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau data, 205,000 people in the U.S. have a February 29 birthday. In translation, that means 0.07% of the population or a probability of 1 in 1,461. If you're a leaper (leap-year baby), you have beaten the odds. However, that also means you may celebrate your actual birthday four times lesser than most people.





National Freedom Day - February 1, 2024



This day was founded to celebrate the freedoms we enjoy as U.S. citizens, freedoms that we should never take for granted. Freedom is one of the founding principles of the United States of America and this day was envisioned as a way for all citizens to take a moment to appreciate how lucky they are. We should all be thankful for the many freedoms we are afforded as citizens of this great country!


This day was originally proposed as a national holiday by Major Richard Robert Wright, Sr. A former slave, he lobbied Congress to designate a day when the freedom of all Americans would be celebrated. The declaration was officially signed into law by President Harry S. Truman in 1948. With war, unrest and worse in so many parts of the world, our long history recognizing 'freedom' makes living in America a unique opportunity and blessing.

Chinese New Year - February 10, 2024

Chinese New Year starts with the first new moon of the lunar calendar and ends on the first full moon, about 15 days later. The lunar calendar is based on moon cycles, so the dates of the Lunar New Year celebration can change slightly each year. Chinese New Year 2024 starts on Feb. 10 and ends on Feb. 24. In 2024, it's the Year of the Dragon.

There are many legends of how the Lunar New Year festival originated. One legend that dates back thousands of years is that of Nian, a beast who ate human flesh on New Year's Day. Nian was scared of the color red, loud noises and fire, so red paper decorations were put on doors, lanterns were lit and firecrackers were used to keep the beast away. Red is the official color of the holiday.
