The song Twelve Days of Christmas is based on the Twelvetide tradition and gives a special gift for each of the twelve days.



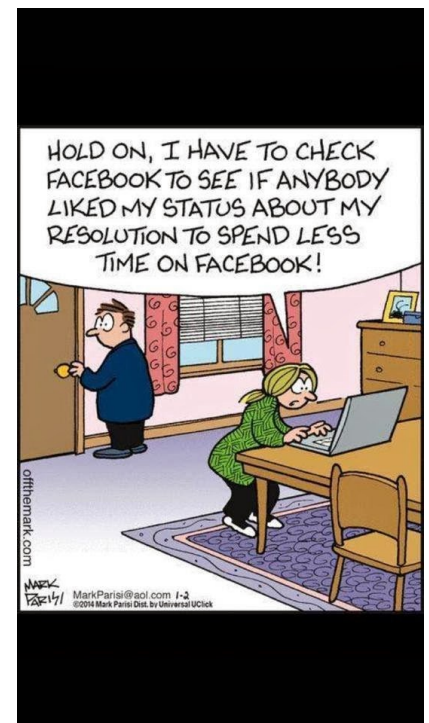

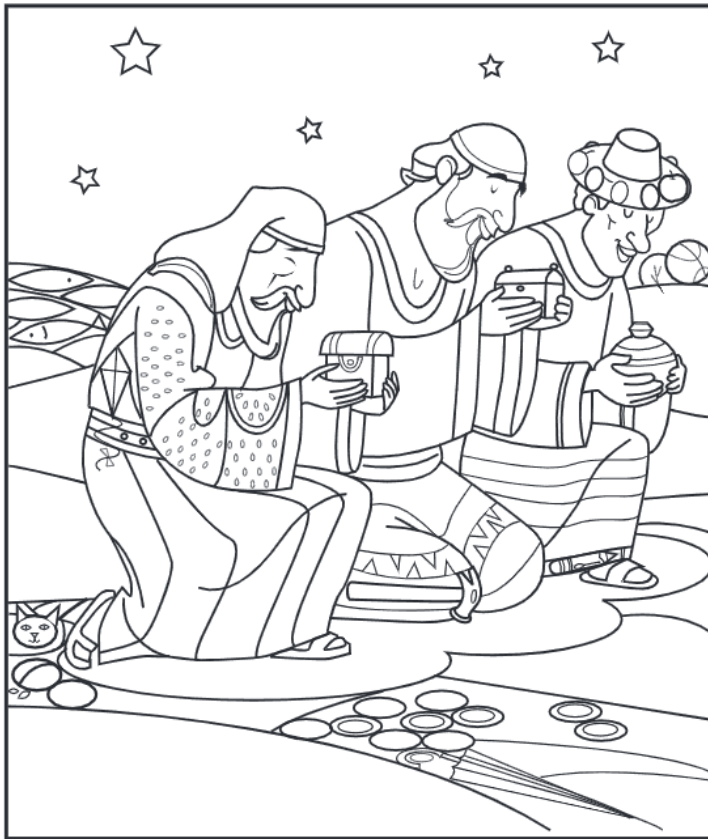
