



THE SYMBOLIC GIFTS GOLD The royal metal; signifies Jesus' Kingship (hence, the gift for a king). FRANKINCENSE Symbol of prayer; signifies Jesus as the High Priest/Mediator between God and man (hence, the gift for a priest). MYRRH A burial ointment; meaning that Jesus had to die for the salvation of all (hence, gift for one who would die).

Epiphany

- January 6th coming twelve days after Christmas.
- Epiphany is derived from the Greek word meaning to show or reveal, when Christ was revealed to non-Jews.
- This time also celebrates the arrival of the Magi (Three Wise Men) who visited Jesus. As the Magi were non-Jews, Christians see their visit as a sign that Christ's message is for all nations.


