Summer Sack Lunch Program

Noble Local (Shenandoah) will be delivering meals to Sarahsville (their school), Belle Valley, Ava, Summerfield, Caldwell UMC, The Happy Time Pool, and, perhaps, Dexter City if they can secure a site. Deliveries of packages containing 3 days of meals for each child will be made on Mondays and Thursdays. 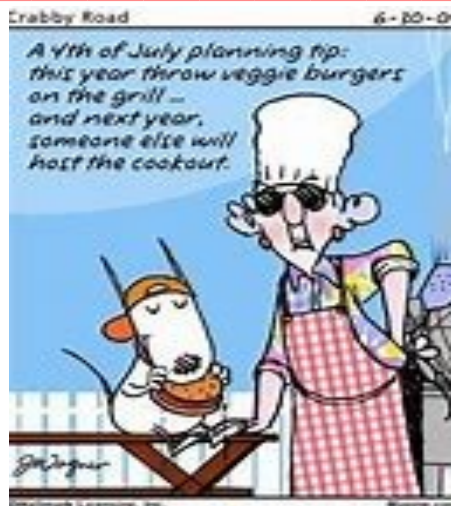
