

East Ohio Conference Re-Districting Proposal to Annual Conference 2023



Considering rapid changes in our church and culture, Bishop Tracy S. Malone convened a task group to look at current trends and consider how to best address these realities. The primary task of this group was to study these realities and recommend how many districts are needed in the East Ohio Conference to address these trends and to best position Conference laity and clergy to live into our shared vision and mission. Bishop Malone introduced the process for redistricting in February 2022. Per ¶ 415.4 of *The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church 2016*, the bishop and district superintendents will "form the districts, after the number of the same has been determined by vote of the Annual Conference."

Following the action of the 2023 East Ohio Annual Conference to determine the number of districts Bishop Malone and the Cabinet will work to develop new boundary lines at their September meeting. The goal is for new districts to be in place on January 1, 2024.

Proposal

After receiving and reviewing the report from the task group, the East Ohio Conference Cabinet makes the proposal to the Annual Conference to reorganize around four districts. The Cabinet believes redistricting in this way will empower the East Ohio Conference to be more flexible, creative, and courageous in living into the principle that districts and conferences exist to support the local church. Following Annual Conference action, the next step per ¶ 415.4 of The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church is for the bishop and Cabinet to work together to draw the district boundaries.



New Year's Resolution Recommitment Day – June 1

It's a time to take a step back and study your resolutions, the progress you've made so far, and the actions you'll take to keep moving forward. Because most people abandon their New Year's resolutions shortly after making them, this holiday is an excellent way to keep track of your efforts. It's also a refresher for those whose resolutions have fallen by the wayside. You might have stuck to your resolutions, but you run out of steam midway through the year. Burnout affects everyone, no matter how dedicated one may be to their cause. Taking the time to renew your motivation by reminding yourself why you're doing it is an excellent way to recommit to your resolutions.



June 4, 1989 - The Chinese government ordered its troops to open fire on unarmed protesters in Tiananmen Square in Beijing. The Chinese government later claimed only 300 died in the attack. U.S. estimates put the toll at over 3,000. Following the massacre, over 1,600 demonstrators were rounded up and jailed, with 27 being executed.

June 5, 1968 - Robert F. Kennedy was shot and mortally wounded while leaving the Hotel Ambassador in Los Angeles.

June 14, 1951 - Univac 1, the world's first commercial electronic computer was unveiled in Philadelphia. It was installed at the Census Bureau and utilized a magnetic tape unit as a buffer memory.

June 17, 1972 - Following a seemingly routine burglary, five men were arrested at the National Democratic Headquarters in the Watergate complex in Washington, D.C. However, subsequent investigations revealed the burglars were actually agents hired by the Committee for the Re-election of President Richard Nixon. Eventually leading to the resignation of President Nixon on August 9, 1974.



June 6, 1944 - D-Day, the largest amphibious landing in history, began in the earlymorning hours as Allied forces landed in Normandy on the northern coast of France.

Not all heroes wear capes — some wear camo. Numerous stories continue to be told of men and women who endured the unthinkable and achieved the unbelievable during D-Day and World War II. Their stories are inspiring and allow us to put names and faces to the stories we heard in history class.

Indianapolis 500 - May 28, 2023

The Indianapolis 500 is the world's most iconic automobile race. Indy cars, as opposed to the stock cars of NASCAR, whiz around the 2.5-mile oval track at speeds exceeding 200 mph for a total of 500 miles. First run in 1911, the race is now held on the Sunday of Memorial Day weekend at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway known to racing fans around the world as the Brickyard. This is the 103rd running of the race. The Indianapolis Motor Speedway, which hosts the event, was built in 1909.

Three drivers have won the Indy 500 four times – AI Unser, AJ Foyt, and Rick Mears.

Memorial Day is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military. Memorial Day 2023 will occur on Monday, May 29.

Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the Civil War and became an official federal holiday in 1971. Many Americans observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings and participating in parades. Unofficially, it marks the beginning of the summer season.

Pentecost – May 28, 2023

The word has its roots in the Greek word 'pentecoste,' which means '50th day.' Pentecost is a major festival in the Christian church and is celebrated by believers on the Sunday that falls on the 50th day of Easter. The day is commemorated as the moment



in history that the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles and other disciples following the crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension of Christ. Pentecost celebrates the faith and love that Christians have for the church and Christ. It's a good day to reaffirm our spiritual beliefs.
