May reminds us, as Christians and United Methodists, that we hold to an Apostolic faith with all Believers, which is founded on the belief that we as the Church are the "body of Christ"- a living expression of Jesus on earth today, until His return. Jesus told the disciples that they were to be God's witnesses, they were being sent as the Church to do God's work; "go into the world and make disciples", Jesus said, preaching and teaching, baptizing, praying for the healing of the sick, showing mercy, justice, and love to all people. Jesus ascended back to heaven; leaving us to do God's work.

We as the Church are empowered to do God's work. Jesus promised that as He returned to Heaven, the Holy Spirit would be sent to "fill and empower" believers, to enable us to do God's work, just as he had done. As Jesus ascended into heaven, two angels told the disciple "that this same Jesus would return" at the end of the Age. (Acts 1:1-11) This year Ascension Day is Thursday May 26th. It marks 40 days after Easter; we will observe on Sunday May 22^{nd.} to highlight Jesus' Ascension, which directs us to the Great Commission, which Jesus commands us to "Go and make disciples...;" we are to do God's work until Jesus returns.

The Great Commission is given to The Church to be The Body of Christ on earth today; not just the first century church: the Apostles and early church leaders. We are that same Church, today. We are to show Jesus to the world, we are to love the lost, the lonely, and the most unlikely. As I see it, the Church needs to be The Church today, so people come to experience God's grace, love and mercy. Think for a moment; who told you about Jesus, and when did you commit your life to Jesus?

I will begin a sermon series on The Church: Who we are, What we are to Be, What we believe and Why we do certain things. We as the Church should not just do what 'we've always done', but follow Jesus' teachings, obey His commands, and be aware of what it means to be Christians, and The Church. For 2000 years it has taken commitment, discipline, and a desire to love the lost, and lead them to Jesus. God is still working in us, and through us.

Remember these upcoming dates:

Memorial Weekend & Sunday (May 28/30th.) a time to remember loved-ones who have died. God calls the living and those who have died to be faithful; God loves us and requires us to love one another. As you visit the graves of family and friends; remember Jesus's promises, that "He has prepared a place" for us", and that One Day, He will return and "the dead in Christ shall rise first, then we who remain shall be together with Him."

May 29th is Graduation Weekend for area schools; it is a busy season and we will honor and celebrate our graduates on the 29th. As we advance and achieve in many areas of life; we are all called upon to be faithful, no matter what our job may be. To our graduates and everyone: remember to seek God in all you do, God is at work in and through each of us. Be a witness for God in the world



Fair Trade Day – May 13, 2022

Fair trade aims to create a more equal and positive working situation for laborers around the world. Many laborers producing some of the world's most lucrative products—like coffee, clothing, and chocolate—are living in poverty and collecting painfully low wages. Fair Trade aims to change this. When workers are paid fairly, they and their families can lead better lives. That leads to a healthier world, which benefits everyone. The fight for fair trade is a powerful eye-opener into some of the many other injustices in our world, and what we can do to improve them.

World Migratory Bird Day – May 14, 2022


At least 4,000 different species of birds migrate, which adds up to about 40% of the entire avian population. And they all do it in pursuit of food. Twice every year, these birds will fly to warmer climates for the winters, and then return home to breed. Migration itself is a genetically controlled impulse. It's a primitive trait that even emerges in birds that don't necessarily have to migrate. The ability for birds to navigate and orient themselves during migration is an even more complex phenomenon. Not to mention, birds need to alter their metabolism in order to store enough energy to make the journey, and molt their feathers in preparation for the wear and tear of the long flight.

Pack Rat Day – May 17, 2022

National Pack Rat Day

Although the history of Pack Rat Day is not that clear, it does bring awareness to a more serious subject. Hoarding disorder is the ongoing difficulty to discard possessions regardless of their value or usefulness. People with this difficulty may sometimes feel severe anxiety and distress when having to organize or part with their possessions. Extreme cases of hoarding result in a hindered quality of life as living spaces may also be-

come limited by cluttering or items like newspapers, malfunctioning electronic devices, and old furniture. A cluttered space may lead to a cluttered mind.



Eta Aquariid meteor shower is usually active between April 19 and May 28 every year. In 2022, the Eta Aquarids peaked on the night between May 5–6 around 4am.

The radiant, the point in the sky where the Eta Aquarids seem to emerge from, is in the direction of the constellation Aquarius. The shower is named after the brightest star of the constellation, Eta Aquarii.

The Eta Aquariids is one of two meteor showers created by debris from Comet Halley. The Earth passes through Hal-

ley's path around the Sun a second time in October. This creates the Orionid meteor shower, which peaks around October 20.

Comet Halley takes around 76 years to make a complete revolution around the Sun. The next time it will be visible from Earth is in 2061.


Go Fly a Kite!

Kites have been in existence for nearly 3000 years and have given pleasure to millions of people over the centuries. Kites have been used for religious and ceremonial occasions, fishing, man-lifting, life-saving, signaling, pulling vehicles and even scientific experiments. It was also

the kite which led to the development of one of mankind's greatest inventions, that of the aeroplane.

Go fly a kite likely comes from the literal meaning. If a person goes to fly a kite, this would mean he or she would need to walk away to do so. This is also true for the synonymous expression go jump in a lake. The important part of the expression is go, not what the person will do once he or she goes away.

- 1. The fastest recorded speed of a kite is over 120 mph. (193 km/h).
- 2. The record for the highest single kite flown is 3801 metres (12,471ft).
- 3. The world record for the longest 'kite fly' is 180 hours.
- 4. Kites were used in the American Civil War to deliver letters and newspapers.
- 5. The delta hang glider was a development of flexiwing kite called a Rogallo.
- 6. The first powered aircraft were large box kites with motors fitted to them.
- 7. Ancient stories of fire breathing Dragons were probably a windsock type of kite flown by soldiers in the middle ages which had burning tar in the mouth opening to frighten the enemy in battle.



What is Eastertide?

Many feasts of the church find their origins in the Old Testament and the festival (and liturgical) life of Israel. Before Easter there was (and still is) Pesach—Passover—and before Pentecost there was (and still is) Shavu'ot—the Feast of Weeks. It is important to remember that the story and history of the church is not separate from, nor greater than the story of Israel. Indeed the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob is the one whom we worship and serve! As Paul remarks in Romans, we have been grafted into David's line—into Jesse's branch—and are part of the new Israel. Easter is not just one day or one weekend, it is a whole season. In fact, Eastertide or Paschal time as it is also known lasts a full 50 days, from Resurrection Sunday till the Pentecost (the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church (see Acts 2). This makes it the longest liturgical season in the liturgical year, longer than both Christmas or lent. The Easter season is an invitation to explore more deeply, and celebrate
