Greetings Caldwell Church family and friends

Last Sunday June 5th we celebrated *Pentecost*, the day Jesus fulfilled his promise by sending the Holy Spirit to his followers, so they could continue the work which he begun. The Spirit continues to work today, helping us to reach the world for God's kingdom. As we are in the season of Pentecost; for the next several months, I will be focusing the weekly scripture and messages on how The Holy Spirit, led the early believers from Jerusalem to the "ends of the earth," establishing The Church throughout the world.

I will include in my messages, not just examples of the Spirit's work in the past but help to encourage us to seek the Holy Spirit's leading in today's Church here in Caldwell; it is the same Holy Spirit working in us as in the early Church. Churches around the world today are faced with many challenges; we really need the Spirit to keep us focused on living for Jesus, making disciples and help to transform the world for God's Kingdom.

This week June 9-11; The East Ohio Annual Conference will meet in Akron, Ohio, at the John S. Knight Center. Our Bishop Tracy S. Malone will be overseeing our gathering. This year's theme is: "Let Us Live Love" taken from **1 John 4:7-13**. This year's Annual Conference will be the first time in three years, that we will be able to meet face to face; gathering with friends and colleagues, joining in worship, celebrating the lives and ministries of those who served faithfully. Some clergy are retiring; other clergy and laity [church leaders] have entered *The Church Triumphant*. We will celebrate with some entering into ministry: as Licensed Local Pastors, Commissioning Deacon's, and Ordaining Elders to serve our churches, [In the United Methodist Church; Deacons and Elders serve in roles of pastoral leadership, but every Christian is to be a servant in The Church.]

We will worship together, hear reports of our church's current works and needs; and how our conference is changing. We will vote on issues that affect our East Ohio congregations from Ashtabula to Marietta, from the Ohio River area towards Columbus. As a reminder: we are in the Southern Hills District: Rev. Laura White is our District Superintendent, myself (Rev. Jeff Coggins), along with Mr. John Grabianowski will be Caldwell's clergy & lay-delegates, along with Cathy Crock as a District lay delegate; I (Pastor Jeff) leave the morning of June 8th, for Akron to be in a closed Clergy Session. Please keep us all in prayer as we travel and spend these days together. Also keep in mind that what we vote on does not affect the General Church worldwide; those major issues are to be voted upon in 2024 at General Conference in Minneapolis, MN.

We are Christ's Church, doing the work through the Spirit.







Flag Day – June 14, 2022

June 14, 1777 - John Adams introduced a resolution before Congress mandating a United States flag, stating, "...that the flag of the thirteen United States shall be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white on a blue field, representing a new constellation." The number and arrangement of stars have changed as the number of states has increased over the centuries. The current flag has remained the same since 1960. This anniversary is celebrated each year in the U.S. as Flag Day.

It's easy to get so caught up in our day-to-day lives that we sometimes forget to be thankful for the bigger picture. Flag Day reminds us that we are one country — united — despite our disagreements.

While many of us learned that Betsy Ross, a seamstress from Philadelphia, was the designer of the flag, this legend has been discredited. According to many sources, President George Washington did visit Betsy in Philadelphia but had brought a flag design with him that contained 13 red and white stripes and 13 six-pointed stars set in a circle.

Accordingly, the only thing Ms. Ross suggested about the flag was to use five-pointed stars (mullets) rather than six-pointed ones (estoiles). Many credit Betsy Ross for sewing one of the first US flags made out of wool bunting, but historians cannot confirm if she actually made the first flag ever.

Some credit Francis Hopkinson, a signer of the Declaration of Independence, with the design of the original flag. Hopkinson himself felt that he was the designer and should be compensated for it by Congress, but Congress argued that many were responsible for the design so he was never paid.





June 10, 1922—Judy Garland (1922-1969) was born in Grand Rapids, Minnesota (as Frances Gumm). She is best remembered for her portrayal of Dorothy Gale in *The Wizard of Oz* (1939) and other films including *Meet Me in St. Louis* (1944) and *Easter Parade* (1948). She became one of the most popular concert performers of the 1950s and '60s and broke box-office records in New York City and London. She was found dead of an overdose of sleeping pills in London on June 22, 1969.

June 12, 1963 - Civil rights leader Medgar Evers was assassinated in Jackson, Mississippi, by a rifle bullet from an ambush. He had been active in seeking integration of schools and voter registration for African Americans in the South. Widespread public outrage following his death led President John F. Kennedy to propose a comprehensive Civil Rights law. Evers was buried in Arlington National Cemetery.



TRINITY SUNDAY

It falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost. Trinity Sunday, in its essence, celebrates the mystery of faith and unity of the Holy Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity, which is not present in Scripture, does not have any explanation. It is a complete mystery as to how the Trinity came to be, and why God has appeared to humans in three different forms. Trinity Sunday celebrations call for utmost faith to be shown in the existence of the Trinity. Trinity Sunday calls for unity in every sense of the word. While there are three separate forms of God, the Trinity still symbolizes unity. Moreover, Christians unite all over the world to celebrate the Trinity on Sundays, and not just on Trinity Sunday.

The UMC General Commission on the Status and Role of Women: Advocating for Women for 50 Years


This year, the General Commission on the Status and Role of Women (GCSRW) marks its 50th year in advocating for women in the life of the Church, leaving in its history a trail of incredible ministry programs and projects that have challenged and continue to provoke the Church to consider how it can achieve full and equal participation of women.

With all of the progress emerging from the international women's movement of 1972 in the background, Methodists joined this record-breaking year by launching the General Commission on the Status and Role of Women (GCSRW) in 1972. The Commission, initially the result of a study of the denomination, gave Methodists an agency to singularly focus on the full participation of women in the life of the Church. Fashioned from the petitions of women across the denomination and the prowess of the Women's Division (which became United Methodist Women in 1972), GCSRW's nascent life manifested a precise vision, which expanded over its existence. Yet, its function and programs verified its necessity and the agency earned permanent status by the 1976 General Conference.




