





On this day in 1790 the U.S. CoastGuard was formed! Wishing a BIG HAPPY BIRTHDAY to the Coasties!

U.S. Coast Guard Birthday – August 4, 2022

Alexander Hamilton, the first Secretary of the Treasury, founded the Revenue Marine — which later became the U.S. Coast Guard. The Coast Guard is 232 years old in 2022. The U.S. Coast Guard provides maritime safety enforcement, marine and environmental protection and military naval support. As far as structure is concerned, U.S. Coast Guard is part of the Department of Homeland Security during peacetime, the U.S. Coast Guard functions under the Navy in war time. The U.S. Coast Guard is a part of the International

Ice Patrol, which monitors and reports movements of icebergs around the world.

National Underwear Day – August 5, 2022

The first underwear dates back to prehistoric times — with humans wearing a loincloth. During the Middle Ages, men wore linen shorts or 'braies.' Women wore a 'shift' under their dresses. In Britain, pants were long drawers covering the whole leg. (In fact, the word, 'panties' evolved from a shortened version of the word 'pants.')





Balloons to Heaven Day – August 6, 2022

Balloons to Heaven Day hopes to create awareness of the pain and trauma that gun violence causes to families all over the U.S. A day when we remember the senseless deaths of thousands of people, often children and young people. For families who've lost loved

ones, it's a day to release their spirits, send them love, and celebrate their lives. Many people write notes and attach them to the balloons before releasing them. Most importantly, balloons are visual reminders to families everywhere who are coping with grief. A reminder that they are not alone in their pain.



Hiroshima Day – August 6, 2022



In memory of the fateful day and of those who lost their lives, Hiroshima Day is observed yearly on August 6. The observance serves as a reminder of the day when a nuclear weapon was used during an armed conflict between the United States and Japan, and the lives that were lost when an entire city was razed to the ground. Little did they know that the effects of the atomic bomb that was dropped by the U.S. on the city of Hiroshima, Japan in 1945 would be felt by the next generations of Japanese as well. There was a large-scale loss of infrastructure, and a large number of people continued to die years after the incident. The bomb was dropped over the cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in the final year of World War II by the United States. The first bomb was dropped on Hiroshima on August 6, 1945, and after three days, the second bomb was dropped on Nagasaki on August 9, 1945. The bombings killed between 129,000 and 226,000 people and destroyed the infrastructure of both cities. Despite the immense loss to life and property, Hiroshima Day is observed with the hope that such an incident will not be repeated ever again. The day encourages us to work towards an inclusive and peaceful future.

National Farmers Market Week August 7-13, 2022



A farmers' market essentially is a place where food is sold directly from the farmer to the consumer. This means there are no middlemen. Farmer's Markets are where local farmers are provided with an extra opportunity to market the goods they grow. It also serves as a way to advertise and promote the numerous benefits of organic produce, as well as the value of such markets for a community. There are over 8,690 farmers' markets nationwide. The farmers at these markets pocket 90 cents for each dollar of sales.

113 Years Ago Uncommon Cents

In August 1909, one hundred years after his birth, Abraham Lincoln goes into circulation—on the penny. It is the first time a portrait appears on a regular issue U.S. coin. Designer Victor David Brenner's initials, which appear on the back, are later removed, making the 484,000 initialed 1909 pennies minted in San Francisco into collector's items that have sold for thousands of dollars. Today. despite repeated congressional attempts to abolish it, the penny–

cent copper—survives.



The penny is *not* the lowest face value coin ever produced in the U.S. From 1793 to 1857, the U.S. produced half cents. These coins are quite scarce today!

Other coins with denominations the U.S. used to make_that we haven't used in many years include:

the 2-cent piece

the 3-cent piece

the half-dime


Lincoln's face is the only one on a U.S. coin that looks to the right. All other portraits of people on U.S. coins face to the left. You should save all pennies dated 1981 or earlier.

The reason you don't want to spend these pennies is because they're worth more than face value, simply due to the fact that they're made of copper.
