Have you ever thought along the lines of, "Well, God, if you don't want me to do (whatever), then give me a sign! Otherwise, I'm going to do it!" That might seem like a rather childish way of approaching things, but I think we've all thought this way at least once in our lives. But, as I was reading from the book of 1 Samuel 14:1-14 I found myself confused that this is how Jonathan (son of King Saul) approached things!

To summarize, in this story the Israelites were at war with the Philistines. King Saul and his son Jonathan find themselves camping out surveying a Philistine camp. Saul, a rather cautious man, hesitates to attack. This was common for him. Saul rarely made a move unless he had a special word from the priests, or the prophets. This may seem like a good thing, but in reality, Saul was acting cowardly. He often missed opportunities because he was basically saying, "Are you sure God??"


But Jonathan, was the opposite. In fact, he may come off as reckless to us! He and his armor bearer seem to have problems waiting like Saul, so Jonathan says, "let's go to the Philistine camp, and if they say *this*, we won't attack. But if they say *that*, then that will mean that God wants us to attack!" We may read Jonathan as a foolish youth, but he is successful, and he and his armor bearer wipe out the camp on their own!

You see the difference between what Jonathan did, and what we may do, is that Jonathan had an idea of what God had sent them there for. He knows that God sent them to fight the Philistines. He may not have all the details on *how* God wants them to do it, but since he knows God's will, he is willing to take the first steps and trust God will make a way! Jonathan actually shows a great amount of faith here! He has enough faith to take action, even if it is risky!

What has God been placing on your heart lately? Maybe, it is time to take a step out on faith to do it! Even if you don't have all the details yet, trust God will help you out!



### National Bible Week -

## November 19-25, 2023

Starting from the Sunday preceding Thanksgiving, the church encourages reading, listening, and comprehending the basic teachings of the Bible. As the holy season transcends upon us, this month of the year is a great time to come together as a community and share our faith in the name of Jesus.

The Bible is an incredibly detailed, long-preserved snapshot of an ancient culture and religion. For billions of people, the religious text offers hope, strength, and guidance to navigate difficult times. Leading a nation through its toughest days, President Roosevelt conceptualized the idea of a Bible Week to unite Americans with the stories of the Creator told through the virtue of strength and reconciliation.

The Bible, the ultimate bestseller, is central to the religion of Christianity, and the English translation has over 100 versions. National Bible Week celebrates the holy text in all its glory, bringing communities together to read their favorite verses and share personal interpretations with the world.

**November 22, 1963** - At 12:30 p.m., on Elm Street in downtown Dallas, President John F. Kennedy's motorcade slowly approached a triple underpass. Shots rang out. The President was struck in the back, then in the head. He was rushed to Parkland Memorial Hospital where fifteen doctors tried to save him. At 1 p.m., John Fitzgerald Kennedy, 35th President of the United States, was pronounced dead. On board Air Force One, at 2:38 p.m., Lyndon B. Johnson was sworn in as the 36th President.

# Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade - November 23, 2023

The parade was first introduced in 1924 and has continued to grow and develop since then, becoming an important part of the holiday season. Each year the floats become bigger and more elaborate with thousands of volunteers joining in to make this holiday celebration enjoyable for all those watching from home or coming to attend the parade.

The parade introduced its first giant balloon in 1928. The balloons were initially shaped like

various animals but then developed to feature cartoon characters such as Mickey Mouse, Popeye, Superman, and Olaf. The first character featured in the parade was Felix the Cat


