May reminds us, as Christians that we hold to

year it is Thursday May 13th. This means that

Jesus returns. We do not work in our own  
power; But, God gives us the power and ability  
to do the work by the Holy Spirit. God sent the  
Holy Spirit on the *Day of Pentecost*. (Acts2:1-  
11) Pentecost (May 23<sup>rd</sup>) is the fiftieth day  
following Passover, the time of Jesus' Resur-  
rection. Pentecost is a Jewish holiday, which  
celebrates the spring harvest. It was the day  
that the Holy Spirit was given to the Church.  
God's power given to us, to continue the work  
that Jesus had begun; we now continue the  
same work today with the same Holy Spirit  
sent from Heaven to empower us.

The Church's task is to make disciples to "go  
into the entire world. and preach, teach, bap-  
tize, forgive, and heal the sick in Jesus Name.  
(Matt 28: 18-20) Our authority as believers  
comes from God: The Father, Son, and Holy

the world

## NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER MAY 6, 2021

The **National Day of Prayer** is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, inviting people of all faiths to pray for the nation. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. Its purpose is to communicate with every individual the need for personal repentance and prayer and to mobilize the Christian community to intercede for America's leaders and its families.

The National Day of Prayer has great significance for us as a nation as it enables us to recall and to teach the way in which our founding fathers sought the wisdom of God when faced with critical decisions. It stands as a call for us to humbly come before God, seeking His guidance for our leaders and His grace upon us as a people. The unanimous passage of the bill establishing the National Day of Prayer as an annual event, signifies that prayer is as important to our nation today as it was in the beginning.

Our 2021 National Day of Prayer theme prays: "LORD pour out Your LOVE, LIFE, and LIBERTY." Once again praying and proclaiming a promise of God in our theme verse, 2 Corinthians 3:17, "Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty."

*"But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" - Amos 5:24 (NIV)*

The humanity of this generation was on trial in a Minneapolis, MN courtroom for the past few weeks. The Tuesday, April 20 announcement of a guilty verdict against former police officer Derek Chauvin for the murder of George Floyd brought an overwhelming feeling of justice and hope to people across the nation and around the world. This historic verdict is not only a victory for the family of George Floyd it is also a symbolic victory and long-awaited justice for other families of persons who have been unjustifiably killed by police, more specifically and disproportionately, Black and Brown people.

Systemic racism is a complex issue and destructive force that permeates the Church, our communities, and our society. The United Methodist Church stands against racism and has resolutions and Social Principles that call us to stop the criminalization of communities of color in the United States and speak to the deplorable acts of hate and violence against groups or persons. To be an anti-racist and to live into our covenant to be an anti-racist annual conference is an ongoing journey. It requires a continuing commitment to do the work of dismantling racism - and, as the Body of Christ, it is all of our work to do.

We are each called to be light and to shine the light of Christ in the world. We are called to be agents of reconciliation, healing, and hope in the midst of the brokenness and injustice in the world.



Everyone has had that favorite teacher that has helped inspire them. Let's show our appreciation to those who have taught us.


## Cinco de Mayo – May 5, 2021

At the end of the 19th century, “The Lady With the Lamp”— or as she is more widely known, Florence Nightingale — founded modern nursing. 

World Day of Prayer May 5, 2021 Program  
written by women of Vanuatu

The World Day of Prayer is an international ecumenical Christian laywomen's initiative. It is run under the motto "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action," and is celebrated annually in over 170 countries on the first Friday in March. The movement aims to bring together women of various races, cultures and traditions in a yearly common Day of Prayer, as well as in closer fellowship, understanding and action throughout the year. World Day of Prayer is a global ecumenical movement led by Christian women who welcome you to join in prayer and action for peace and justice.

Through the worship service we hear the voices of the Vanuatu women, whom invite us to the Bible story in Matthew 7:24-27. The Republic of Vanuatu was founded on its traditional principles, and the people's faith in God as established in the Constitution of 1980. Vanuatu is a heart-shaped tropical archipelago located in the South Pacific Ocean with over eighty islands which are inhabited. The islands are prone to natural disasters including earthquakes, cyclones and volcanic eruptions. There are seven active volcanoes scattered throughout the islands.


# Annual Conference 2021: Christ Alive in Us!
