The year has flown by too quickly; Charge conference is behind us and we are moving ahead, seeking God's guidance for the future. It is November already! The time for voting and political ads will soon be over; the journey of democracy continues. Please keep all our leaders in prayer.

November is a month for remembering may believe. and celebrating Gods blessings in life. On Sunday, November 1st. we will observe "All Saints Sunday" with a service for remembering loved ones who have entered the Church Triumphant; names read, and candles lit, reflecting on God's gift of life. This is often a moving service which reminds us to reflect upon God's promises, and hope of eternal life. On that same Sunday we will celebrate Holy Communion; First Sunday of the month communion as usual, but we should use this time as a conus, and those who have gone ahead of us.

This month also relates to the Reformation in which the Protestant movement began. Martin Luther, a German priest, monk and professor posted his 95 Thesis on the cathedral door in Wittenberg, Germany, listing abuses within the Christian Church. Luther was not seeking to form a new church, but to help the Church to focus on faith alone for salvation "sola fede" in Jesus Christ for our justification, and salvation. November is a month to remember the Persecuted Church around the world; many Christians are, harassed, imprisoned, or killed each day, yet standing firm in

Give Thanks and Rejoice in Life!




expects to start up the program again in 2021 and looks forward to receiving your incredible support in the new year.

But this one thing I know is true, no matter what your plight.


Our God loves me and you, we're precious in His sight.
